The club also offers Czech and English classes for adults. The school is run by volunteers who have experience in education, work with children and even organization.

The Club works closely with the Czech Embassy. It organized social, cultural, and educational events aimed at reaching wider community in the UK. These are linked to Czech customs and traditions, such as the celebration of St.Nicholas Day, Christmas, Easter etc. which are brought to the British public.

The Club organized several outings for families, fund raisers for nationwide charities, and took part in events around EU nationals issues.

The club seeks regular feedback from parents of children in the supplementary school and nursery. Most of the responses last years were positive while issues raised were acted upon (communication via WhatsApp, new classes) A feedback sheet is also regularly distributed at events which are open to broader public. Responses are predominantly positive, and the Club will continue to offer at these events what stakeholders identified as positive (e.g. bringing Czech, British and other communities together, organizing original events, offering traditional food and confectionary from the Czech and Slovak producers, organizing joint events with other communities).
