With no large scale single event planned for this year, the company turned it's attention to planning new projects that could form the focal point for volunteers and artists to work towards.

To this end, the year was split into 2 parts;

- 1) Proposing the One City One Light project to new venues.
- 2) Developing a smaller tour version of the large scale project.

The second of these points saw several small scale multimedia concerts performed in village halls & churches across Hampshire and Dorset. These concerts & events allowed for volunteers on the project to gain experience & training in event production, with a view to being able to be involved in the larger scale productions.

These volunteers included several students from Bournemouth University who were able to use the project to support their degree courses.

We were also able to use the concerts as a platform for local up and coming musicians to perform on. Some of whom, were performing in front of an audience for the very first time.

By January 2020, we were able to put on our first small scale performance that included all of the elements that were in the larger production originally designed for Salisbury Cathedral. This meant that we were able to film real, personal stories from the local area of Parkstone and present them back to local residents as a multimedia concert production in St John's Church, Parkstone.
