The Aviatrix Project was launched in November 2015 to promote aviation to women and girls and young people. The aim of the project is to raise awareness, particularly amongst women and girls but also young people from disadvantaged and diverse backgrounds, about aviation as a potential career choice. The visits and events are delivered to mixed audiences and our 140 or so volunteers are of both genders. We celebrated our 6th anniversary in November 2021 and have reached out to over 400 schools and colleges across the country as well as developing key partnerships with the aviation industry. We have partnered with a number of large organisations such as easyJet, Stansted Airport Aerozone, The Shuttleworth Collection, Bentley Priory Museum, BWPA as well as a large number of flying schools across the country. The project provides a pathway for female and male pilots to visit schools and work with STEM organisations to encourage girls into careers in aviation. It creates opportunities for professional and private pilots to visit schools to deliver assemblies and workshops, career events, mentoring, networking events as well as offering 'taster' flights.


