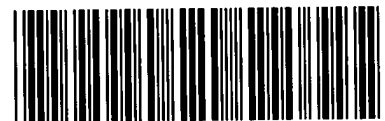



PART 1 - GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF THE COMPANY'S ACTIVITIES AND IMPACT

Worked with Bristol Braille Technology to launch the Canute in July 2020. Until the development of the Canute (a multi-line Braille display), the only screens to display electronic Braille for E-books or computers, had only one line of text. With the Canute, blind people will be able to study Maths and Music electronically, and use 2 dimensional Braille. This will give easy access to tables and graphics. Maps can also be displayed in a more meaningful fashion. To achieve this development, I tested upgrades of the software, responded to user feedback and applied for grants and funding. I was instrumental in finding many customers who have purchased the Canute, and now 89 have been sold. I travelled to Las Vegas for the National Federation of the Blind convention, where we were awarded First Prize of the Dr Bolottin Award for Services to Blind People.

We were awarded lottery funding to create a National data base of audio landmarks useful to blind people.

I visited Zambia in March to April 2019 for 2 weeks. We supported the ongoing work of the Ndola school for the blind. We upgraded the computer, fixed 2 Braille embossers and set up a link with an engineer in England for ongoing repairs and maintenance. Ensured Braille typewriters provided would get used by the pupils. Enabled a trading group of blind adults in Kongonga on their journey to be self-sufficient; 2 shops now sell their hand crafted items. We purchased all the craft items they currently had available, and they were able to invest in 200 day-old chicks, to rear to 6 weeks old and sell. Since then this work has continued with rearing further batches of chicks which are sold to the local hospital.

Vision Through Sound paid for farming training for 2 Zambians, so that their farming crops will yield double the amount of Maize.


