10	ORDINARY RESOLUTION: APPOINTMENT OF AUDITORS
	Q: How long have the LLT had the auditors?

R: Since we began as an academy in 2017, for four years.

# Q: Is there anything in the rules that stipulate the maximum period for auditors or not?

R: It would be good practice to change auditors at some point, but there isn't anything that stipulates we must change.

### Q: We are not at that point yet?

R: Allots have kept their price competitive which has helped.

#### Q: Has the Executive been happy with the process of the auditors?

R: They are very helpful in the audit process. The service is timely and supportive.

The appointment of Allotts as Auditors for the 2021/22 was proposed by AP seconded by IW, all agreed.

IT WAS RESOLVED that Allotts are hereby appointed auditors for the ensuing year.

#### 11 RISKS FACING THE LINK LEARNING TRUST

The Risk Register was not available in the backing papers before the meeting, AK to circulate the register to members.

JP highlighted the Risks to the Trust are: the threat of the pandemic is ongoing; and a reduction in pupil numbers at Barlow Hall; the register is RAG rated and kept under review as a working document.

AY (Adrian Young) highlighted the student numbers and the risk of the pandemic is kept under review by the trustees.

IT WAS RESOLVED the report was received and accepted.

#### 12 THE LINK LEARNING REVIEW OF THE YEAR

The AO (Accounting Officer) gave a verbal report on the year across both schools:

- Both schools have successfully navigated the challenges that Covid brings.
- There have been further improvements in the Remote Education offer.
- There has been further alignment of the finance and business management as evidenced by the internal and annual audits, the successful CIF (Condition Improvement Funding) bids and the positive Health and Safety monitoring.
- The planned growth of the Trust and preparations to take the leadership of Sure Start children's centre, which started in November 2021.
- Maintaining academic standards in both schools.
- Continuation of MTSA (Manchester Trust School Alliance) as a successful alliance of schools following the de-designation of the teaching school.
- JP organised the MTSA conference, held at the Etihad with over 200 attendees and Michael Rosen as guest speaker. Grateful thanks to JP for arranging such a

successful and enjoyable event.

- Continuing the school-to-school support beyond the LLT through the work of SF as an Ofsted Inspector, SF and JK as National Leaders in Education. In Brookburn and Barlow Hall we have Specialists Leaders in Education which support schools outside of the Trust.
- The survey for parents was conducted and with pupil voice activities, shows the overwhelming support for the schools from the stakeholders.

The Chair asked if the trustees wanted to add to the verbal report JK has presented.

- AY re-iterated how grateful the trustees are to the Executive team and the amount of effort it has taken by JP, JK and SF to keep the school open and the children educated over the past year.
- IW stated without wanting to overstep the remit of a member, he would be interested to hear more about some of these interesting initiatives.
- NH added his congratulations to the Executive team, staff and trustees in light of the difficult and challenging year for all.
- AP added his thanks to the staff and Executive team too and highlighted things may not change for some time. How are we as a trust for a couple more years of similar ways of working. How resilient are the staff and is there anything the trust and members can do to look after them? Many of the staff are going above and beyond and there is a limit of how long that can last? How confident are we that we can keep going in these challenging times?
- IW stated with the new variant Omicron, things can change very quickly and need immediate attention. From an NHS perspective they are trying to find effective and supportive ways to renew and refresh the workforce.
- JK stated the focus for the trust board and Executive team has been on well-being and is constantly being reviewed. Morale is very good, and staff have stepped up for the children
- SF The mental health and wellbeing Policy is coming into action, sometimes it is the little things that make the difference. We have good teams of strong people who are keeping going for the sake of the children.
- TM stated the staff have adapted well and the morale is good. Standards in both schools have remained high over the past two years, which should reassure members and trustees. If standards remain high the quality of leadership must be high, which is reassuring.
- AY we have been very resilient the way we have dealt with the pandemic over the
  past 18 months. There is a slight dislocation that we have not had face to face
  meetings, and he looks forward to when we can meet again.
