

PART 1 - GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF THE COMPANY'S ACTIVITIES AND IMPACT

Our open day for the Community Forest Garden was set for 13th July 2019 and we made a huge effort to get the site ready to receive what turned out to be between 70-100 people. We offered homemade cake, tea and coffee which was facilitated by volunteers who came from the Eco shop. There was a talk by Jamie miller from Ty Pren about the construction of the round house building and Alpay and the Mayor opened the site. They introduced the ideas behind community forest gardening. The local paper wrote about the project and a short good quality film was made about the open day, as a gift. At this point all the major structural and site work had been completed and was funded through the Eco shop donations and volunteers work. The compost toilet took 23 volunteer hours (v h) and the roof was finished by putting the soil and plants on, which took 43vh.

We received a grant from the Community Fund: Awards for All, to further the CIC's objectives. We aimed to introduce more people to the garden through working with schools by offering forest schooling opportunities, and free or subsidised forest schooling in holiday times throughout the year. 60 children attended 5 sessions during 2019 a day a week from Cardigan school but due to covid this was out put on hold. We led subsidised forest school on weekends and many children have accompanied their parents at the garden volunteer days when there was no school.

The grant also paid for 9 planting days these were facilitated by 5 tutors 2 of which spoke Welsh, who guided the community to plant trees and fruit bushes. Staking out and planting took place from November 2019 through to March 2020. The garden was the officially closed from April to May with only a couple of people attending weekly to take care of trees and plants, especially as there was an early drought. When we could officially accept volunteers we ran coordinated volunteer days every week and in June we ran a weekend a permaculture course as well. The weekend course taught 14 people how to plan with the landscape and its individual needs and gifts in mind. We attained 4 plans which we have then used to direct the planting plan and social spaces for the garden.

We did a huge amount of publicity in Welsh and English, posters, face book, emails, information boards up in the Eco shop and we visited other projects to introduce ourselves. We were on S4C Prynhawn da, and we also had a second film maker produce a film about the director: Alpay Torgut. He had created 4 forest gardens and pioneered community forest gardening in Britain. Alpay a co-director and cofounder of the Forest garden and instigator and manager of the Eco shop died in January 2020. This presented a huge loss for the community and project as Alpay's had commitment, passion and depth of knowledge which are hard to replaced. The other 2 directors and the core volunteers and wider community have supported the project through this enormous transition. During this year, even with the effects of lockdown we have had approximately 86 volunteers, undertaking 802 hours of work accounted for and many hours unaccounted for.

The garden for many people this year has proven to be an incredible resource providing community connection, learning, and valued participation in sustainable activity towards a healthy inclusive future for all. We have planted, staked, mulched, watered, and weeded 126 trees and numerous fruit bushes and herbs. Planned and designed windbreaks using Willow, Sea buckthorn and Elaeagnus. We have completed maintenance on the sheds and building work: lime, cobb rendering, - painting, guttering, water butts, setting up the tools store, mending a roof leak, making 3 benches, mowing paths and taking out blackthorn. Everyone has enjoyed the opportunity to learn together about the complexities of this garden landscape and make the decisions for the ongoing design. There is now a large team of core volunteers who can really make informed decisions and support others to get involved.

At the open day in July 2019, we had our first invitation to feedback ideas about the garden. We have run the weekend permaculture course which 14 people undertook very informed assessment of the garden and human needs, and created 4 designs. These designs contributed to the work undertaken.

As mentioned previously, we have had over 80 people come to volunteer at the forest garden, and we are always open to discuss their ideas and wishes for the garden.

Our regular, committed team of volunteers consists of around 10 people, and we have carried out focused 'ideas sessions' for them to be involved in future plans for the garden. Indeed they are planning and creating the garden every week, deciding where features should go and and making decisions regarding planting, etc.

Stakeholders also include the children who attend forest school sessions and we have also asked them what they would like to have and do in the garden.
