REPORT OF THE MEMBERS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2009

The members present their report with the financial statements of the LLP for the year ended 31 March 2009.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the LLP in the year under review was that of Chartered Surveyors.

REVIEW OF BUSINESS

The members aim to present a balanced and comprehensive review of the development and performance of the business during the year and its position at the year end. The review is consistent with the size and nature of the business and is written in the context of the risks and uncertainties that the business faces.

The LLP's main activities are chartered surveyo's and rural property consultants.

The key financial performance indicators are those that show the financial performance and strength of the LLP as a whole, which are considered to be turnover and net profit.

Overall the net profit has decreased by 5.54% with increased turnover of 7.38%

As with many businesses of similar size, the business environment in which the LLP operates continues to be challenging. However the different areas of work have all shown positive results with a strong reputation being built with clients. The partnership continues to invest heavily in staffing, IT and training and this investment underpins the growth in the turnover. Whilst the changing economy brings new challenges the members are confident of the strength of the business to maintain its activities and continue growth.

During the year the partnership purchased the trade and assets of two competitors, one based in Nottinghamshire and the other in Merseyside.

The subsidiary company purchased the shares of a competitor based in Cheshire.

The LLP continues to manage financial risks via an overdraft and members' capital.

RESULTS FOR THE YEAR AND ALLOCATION TO MEMBERS

The profit for the year before members' remuneration and profit shares was £2,789,756 (2008 - £2,599,418 profit).

REPORT OF THE MEMBERS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2009

MEMBERS' INTERESTS

The remuneration committee decide upon the basic allocation of profits for each class of member prior to the year end which is treated in the accounts as members remuneration charged as an expense. The final allocation of profits is made following the year end having assessed performance and the final management accounts.

During the year £942,407 was transferred from Reserves to Loans and other debts due to members. An additional £890,223 was transferred following the year end but prior to approval of the accounts.

A member may serve an Early Repayment Notice on the LLP on or prior to the accounts date next following (or which coincides with) his 61st birthday, that he wishes to withdraw his capital from the LLP in the two year period prior to his retirement.

Following service of an Early Repayment Notice, the LLP shall repay to the relevant member his capital in four equal instalments prior to his retirement, with the first three payments being made 6, 12 and 18 months after the accounts date next following (or which coincides with) his 61st birthday, and the final payment being made on the date of his retirement from the LLP.

STATEMENT OF MEMBERS' RESPONSIBILITIES

The members are responsible for preparing the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Legislation applicable to limited liability partnerships requires the members to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the members have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). The financial statements are required by law to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the LLP and of the profit or loss of the LLP for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the members are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the LLP will continue in business.

The members are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the LLP and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985 as modified by the Limited Liability Partnerships Regulations 2001. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the LLP and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

NOTE'S TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2009

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting by Limited Liability Partnerships.

Exemption from preparing consolidated financial statements

The financial statements contain information about Fisher German LLP as an individual LLP and do not contain consolidated financial information as the parent of a group. The LLP is exempt under Section 248 of the Companies Act 1985 as modified by the Limited Liability Partnerships Regulations 2001 from the requirements to prepare consolidated financial statements.

Goodwill

Goodwill, being the amount paid in connection with the acquisition of businesses in 2007 and 2009, is being amortised evenly over its estimated useful life of ten years.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life or, if held under a finance lease, over the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

Office equipment etc.

- 25% on reducing balance

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts or finance leases are capitalised in the balance sheet. Those held under hire purchase contracts are depreciated over their estimated useful lives. Those held under finance leases are depreciated over their estimated useful lives or the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

The interest element of these obligations is charged to the profit and loss account over the relevant period. The capital element of the future payments is treated as a liability.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The LLP operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the LLP's pension scheme are charged to the profit and loss account in the period to which they relate.

Revenue Recognition

Services provided to clients during the year, which at the balance sheet date have not been billed to clients, have been recognised as turnover in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 5 'Reporting the substance of transactions: Application Note G Revenue Recognition'. Turnover recognised in this manner is based on an assessment of the fair value of the services provided at the balance sheet date as a proportion of the total value of the engagement. Provision is made a sainst unbilled amounts on those engagements where the right to receive payment is contingent on factors outside the control of the partnership. Unbilled revenue is included in debtors.

During the year sales of £42,773 (2008 £63,609) were made to and purchases of £14,718 (2008 £1,203) were made from Fisher German Priestner Limited, a company in which Fisher German Limited owns 50% of the share capital. At the year end £15,544 (2008 £57,711) was due from Fisher German Priestner Limited. There was also a management charge to Fisher German Priestner Limited of £17,472 paid within the year.

During the year Fisher German LLP borrowed £650,000 from Fisher German Limited and paid interest of £957. The loan was repaid during the year. A dividend of £188,640 (2008 nil) was received in the year.
