REPORT OF THE MEMBERS for the Period 1 September 2016 to 31 December 2016

The members present their report with the financial statements of the LLP for the period 1 September 2016 to 31 December 2016.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the LLP in the period under review was that of freight forwarding and railway transportation.

REVIEW OF BUSINESS

The period under review is not directly comparable to the preceding year as it is a short period and the restated comparative amounts are unreliable as described in note 7. Notwithstanding this, based on annualising the results of the current short period to stand comparison with the twelve month comparative figures in these financial statements, during the period under review the LLP's turnover increased by 55.8% and its gross profit margin increased to 21.4% from 10.68%. The LLP reported a profit of \$14,966,384.

The increase in turnover for the period was due to increased efficiency relative to the competition on the LLPs key transportation routes. The LLP was able to report an increased profit through its growing customer base, increasingly good reputation and its continuing policy of implementing optimal schemes on the movement of wagons, use of modern methods and technologies and of flexibility in its dealings with customers and suppliers. These factors leave it well placed to improve on its performance in future periods. The LLP's core principles of reliability, cost effectiveness and enhanced security remain at the centre of its service ethos.

The management of the LLP are continuing to work on new projects and on the expansion of services to new customers in existing and new territories to further strengthen its position.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

The main objective of the LLP is to create a competitive and successful business with long term perspectives and prospects.

The profit for the period before members' remuneration and profit shares was \$14,966,384 (2016 - \$14,152,703 profit).

MEMBERS' INTERESTS

Policy for drawings, subscription and repayment of members' capital is as follows:

Drawings

The policy for members' drawings is to distribute the majority of profit during the financial year, taking into account the need to maintain sufficient funds to finance the working capital and other needs of the business. The sets the designated members level of members' drawings and reviews this annually.

Capital

The capital requirements of the business are determined from time to time by the designated members. Each member is required to subscribe a proportion of this capital. The amount of capital subscribed by each member is linked to the profit share allocated to that member. No interest is paid on capital. The repayment of capital is dependent on members' capital requirement. Members leaving the partnership may have their capital retained unless other arrangements have been agreed between the member and the designated members.

Members' profit shares

Members are remunerated solely out of the profits of the partnership. The designated members set members' profit shares in advance and reviews the allocation. Members' profit shares comprise a variable amount, the value of which is dependent upon the level of profit achieved in accordance with the profit share allocated to that member. Profits are allocated in full and there is transparency amongst the members of the total income allocated to each individual member.

CHARITABLE DONATIONS AND EXPENDITURE

During the period under review the LLP has donated an amount of \$240,500 in medical equipment to V Vakhidov Academician Surgery centre.

STATEMENT OF MEMBERS' RESPONSIBILITIES

The members are responsible for preparing the Report of the Members and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Legislation applicable to limited liability partnerships requires the members to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the members have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). Under legislation applicable to limited liability partnerships the members must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the LLP and of the profit or loss of the LLP for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the members are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and accounting estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the LLP will continue in business.

The members are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the LLP's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the LLP and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006 as applied to LLPs by the Limited Liability Partnerships (Accounts and Audit) (Application of Companies Act 2006) Regulations 2008. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the LLP and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

REPORT OF THE INDEPENDENT AUDITORS TO THE MEMBERS OF WONDERNET EXPRESS LLP

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Wondernet Express LLP (the 'LLP') for the period ended 31 December 2016 which comprise the Income Statement, Other Comprehensive Income, Balance Sheet, Reconciliation of Members' Interests, Cash Flow Statement and Notes to the Cash Flow Statement, Notes to the Financial Statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards, including Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

This report is made solely to the LLP's members, as a body, in accordance with Chapter 3 of Part 16 of the Companies Act 2006 as applied to LLPs by the Limited Liability Partnerships (Accounts and Audit) (Application of Companies Act 2006) Regulations 2008. Our audit work has been undertaken so that we might state to the LLP's members those matters we are required to state to them in a Report of the Auditors and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the LLP and the LLP's members as a body, for our audit work, for this report, or for the opinions we have formed.

In our opinion the financial statements:

- give a true and fair view of the state of the LLP's affairs as at 31 December 2016; and
- except for the possible effects of the matter described in the basis for qualified opinion paragraph, of its profit for the period then ended;
- have been properly prepared in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice; and
- have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act 2006 as applied to LLPs by the Limited Liability Partnerships (Accounts and Audit) (Application of Companies Act 2006) Regulations 2008.

Basis for qualified opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (UK) (ISAs (UK)) and applicable law. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements section of our report. We are independent of the LLP in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in the UK, including the FRC's Ethical Standard, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. We were appointed as auditors of the LLP on 6 March 2018. As described in note 7 the financial statements of the LLP for the year ended 31 August 2016 were not subject to an audit and the opening balances for the period under review were unaudited and subsequently changed in the comparative figures by a prior year adjustment. In the absence of prior audited financial statements, we were unable to satisfy ourselves by alternative means that the opening balances as at 1 September 2016 were fairly stated. Since opening balances enter into the determination of the financial performance and cash flows, we were unable to determine whether adjustments might have been necessary for the period under review in respect of the income for the period reported in the statement of comprehensive income and the net cash flows from operating activities reported in the statement of cash flows.

Conclusions relating to going concern

- We have nothing to report in respect of the following matters in relation to which the ISAs (UK) require us to report to you where:
- the members' use of the going concern basis of accounting in the preparation of the financial statements is not appropriate; or
- the members have not disclosed in the financial statements any identified material uncertainties that may cast significant doubt about the LLP's ability to continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting for a period of at least twelve months from the date when the financial statements are authorised for issue.

Other information

1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Wondernet Express LLP is registered in England and Wales. The LLP's registered number and registered office address can be found on the General Information page.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting by Limited Liability Partnerships. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

First year adoption of Financial Reporting Standard 102 (FRS 102)

These financial statements for the period ended 31 December 2016 are the first that are prepared in accordance with FRS 102. The previous financial statements were prepared in accordance with UK GAAP, the date of transition to FRS 102 is 1 September 2015.

Turnover

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, excluding discounts, rebates, value added tax and other sales taxes.

Financial instruments

The company has elected to apply the provisions of Section 11 'Basic Financial Instruments' and Section 12 'Other Financial Instruments Issues' of FRS 102 to all of its financial instruments. Financial instruments are recognised in the company's statement of financial position when the company becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. Financial assets and liabilities are offset, with the net amounts presented in the financial statements, when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

Basic financial assets and liabilities

Basic financial assets, and liabilities are initially measured at transaction price including transaction costs and are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the transaction is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial assets and liabilities classified as receivable or payable within one year are not amortised. Debt instruments are subsequently carried at amortised cost, using the effective interest rate method. Trade creditors are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of business from suppliers. Amounts payable are classified as current liabilities if payment is due within one year or less. If not, they are presented as non-current liabilities. Trade creditors are recognised initially at transaction price and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Classification of financial liabilities

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the company after deducting all of its liabilities.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents are basis financial assets and include cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into US Dollars at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into US Dollars at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of transaction. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating result.

Functional currency and presentation currency

The individual financial statements of each group entity are presented in the currency of the primary economic environment in which the entity operates (its functional currency). The results and financial position of the LLP are measured using US Dollars.

Transactions and balances

In preparing the financial statements of the individual entities, transactions in currencies other than the functional currency of the individual entities (foreign currencies) are recognised at the spot rate at the dates of the transactions, or at an average rate where this rate approximates the actual rate at the date of the transaction. At the end of each reporting period, monetary items denominated in foreign currencies are retranslated at the rates prevailing at that date. Non-monetary items that are measured in terms of historical cost in a foreign currency are not retranslated.

Investments

Investments comprise investments in unquoted equity instruments which are measured at fair value. Changes in fair value are recognised in the income statement. Fair value is estimated by using a valuation technique.

Debtors

Short term debtors are measured at transaction price, less any impairment. Loans receivable are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment.

Creditors

Short term trade creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other financial liabilities, including bank loans, are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Provisions for liabilities

Provisions are recognised when the group has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event, it is probable that the group will be required to settle the obligation, and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

The amount recognised as a provision is the best estimate of the consideration required to settle the present obligation at the end of the reporting period, taking into account the risks and uncertainties surrounding the obligation.

Where the effect of the time value of money is material, the amount expected to be required to settle the obligation is recognised at present value using a pre-tax discount rate. The unwinding of the discount is recognised as a finance cost in the income statement in the period it arises.

The financial statements for the preceding period have been restated in US Dollars, which is the functional currency of the company. In the preceding financial period the members other interests profit and loss account as previously stated was £2,549,303. This has been restated in the comparative figure as loans and other debts due to members of \$44,899,810. The prior year adjustment to the comparative figures is due to a series of fundamental accounting errors. Every comparative amount in the financial statements for the period under review, except for the figures for cash at bank and in hand of \$12,064,349 and members other interests of \$475, has been restated.

The preceding period financial statements stated that the LLP was entitled to exemption from audit under section 477 of the Companies Act 2006, as applied by the Limited Liability Partnership (Accounts and Audit) (Application of Companies Act 2006) Regulation 2008. During the preparation of the financial statements of the LLP for the period under review, and the reconstruction of amended comparative figures, it became apparent to the members that audit exemption for the preceding period had erroneously been claimed contrary to the foregoing provisions of the Companies Act 2006.

The financial statements for the previous period were compiled by an EU accountant who was not trained or based in the UK and with no previous qualification or experience of preparing financial statements under UK statutory law and GAAP. At some point in the past it appears that it was erroneously assumed that the assets test for audit exemption related to the net balance sheet assets rather than the gross assets, and the unaudited financial statements were prepared and filed accordingly. The members of the LLP dispensed with the services of the accountant who retained the prime records and workings used for the preparation of the LLP for the previous period and which have been beyond the control of the members of the LLP since then.

Consequently, the comparative figures for the preceding period have had to be restated based on management, extrapolated and balancing amounts for which, for most figures, no accurate corroborating documents or link figures exist which can be relied upon for the purposes of performing a statutory audit without concluding at the outset that a complete disclaimer of opinion on the preceding year financial statements would result.

14. FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT

The group has exposures to three main areas of risk; foreign exchange currency exposure, liquidity risk and customer credit exposure. To a lesser extent the group is exposed to interest rate risk.

Foreign exchange transactional currency exposure
