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MEMBERS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2019

The members present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2019.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the Partnership comprise the provision of pathology analyical services. On 31 December 2018 the Partnership ceased to trade.

REVIEW OF THE BUSINESS AND KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS

The Partnership provides services through long term contracts and strategic partnerships with the National Health Service and other providers of healthcare services. The performance of the Partnership was in line with the expectations of the members for the financial year to 31 March 2019.

The designated members consider that the principal key performance indicators relating to the Partnership are turnover and operating profit included in these financial statements. During the year the Partnership had a turnover of £210,819 (2018: £366,066) and an operating profit of £1,929 (2018: £2,227).

The following table shows certain line items from the Statement of Comprehensive Income for the year ended 31 March 2019 and for the year ended 31 March 2018. During the year, the Partnership has been transferring its customer contracts to another common partnership, which has resulted in a decline of turnover of 42.4%. The final contract was transferred on 31 December 2018. Administrative expenses in both years are negligible and are positive in 2019 due to the release of an accrual.

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

Financial risk

The Partnership has ceased to trade. There is a low risk that unrecognised historic and unforeseen future liabilities may crystallise. In the event these risks materialise the Partnership has sufficient net assets in the form of cash in bank and in hand.

DESIGNATED MEMBERS

Integrated Path Services Limited, Taunton and Somerset NHS Foundation Trust and Yeovil District Hospital NHS Foundation Trust were designated members of the Partnership throughout the year.

MEMBERS' CAPITAL AND INTERESTS

The level and timing of drawings is decided by the Partnership's Members Board after taking into account the Partnerhip's cash requirements for operating and investment activities. Undistributed profits are shown in 'other reserves' in the statement of changes in members' interests on page 9.

GOING CONCERN

The financial statements have been prepared on a basis other than a going concern basis as all of the Partnership's existing customer contracts were transferred to another common partnership. Consequently, the Partnership ceased trading on 31 December 2018. As a result the operations are seen as discontinued operations and the relevant disclosures have been made in note 8.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

On 31 December 2018 the Partnership ceased to trade and is now a dormant Partnership. On that basis there are no future developments expected for the Partnership.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2019

GENERAL INFORMATION

SW Path Services LLP (the Partnership) is registered and incorporated in England and Wales under the Limited Liability Partnership Act 2000. The address of the registered office is given on the Partnership information page. The nature of the Partnership's operations and its principal activities are set out in the members' report.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' issued by the Financial Reporting Council and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice Accounting by Limited Liability Partnerships (issued January 2017).

These financial statements are presented in pound sterling because that is the currency of the primary economic environment in which the Partnership operates.

The Partnership meets the definition of a qualifying entity under FRS 102 and has therefore taken advantage of the disclosure exemptions available to it in respect of its separate financial statements. Exemptions have been taken in relation to the presentation of a cash flow statement and remuneration of key management personnel.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following accounting policies have been consistently applied.

(a) Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a basis other than a going concern basis as all of the Partnership's existing customer contracts were transferred to another common partnership. Consequently, the Partnership ceased trading on 31. December 2018. As a result the operations are seen as discontinued operations and the relevant disclosures have been made in note 8.

(b) Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Partnership and the revenue can be reliably measured. Revenue is measured as the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, excluding discounts, rebates, value added tax and other sales taxes. The following criteria must also be met before revenue is recognised:

Rendering of services Revenue from a con-

Revenue from a contract to provide services is recognised in the period in which the services are provided in accordance with the stage of completion of the contract when all of the following conditions are satisfied:

- the amount of revenue can be measured reliably;
- it is probable that the Partnership will receive the consideration due under the contract;
- the stage of completion of the contract at the end of the reporting year / period can be measured reliably, and,
- the costs incurred and the costs to complete the contract can be measured reliably.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2019

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued):

(c) Taxation

The taxation payable on the Partnership's profits is the personal liability of the members, although payment of such liabilities is administered by the Partnership on behalf of the members. Consequently, neither Partnership taxation nor related deferred taxation are accounted for in the financial statements.

(d) Debtors

Short term debtors are measured at transaction price, less any impairment.

(e) Cash at bank and in hand

Cash is represented by cash in hand and deposits with financial institutions repayable without penalty on notice of not more than 24 hours.

(f) Creditors

Creditors are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of business from suppliers. Creditors are measured at transaction price.

(g) Financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the Partnership becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. Financial assets and financial liabilities are initially measured at fair value and are subject to impairment review on an annual basis.

3. CRITICAL ACCOUNTING ESTIMATES AND JUDGEMENTS

In the application of the Partnership's accounting policies, which are described in note 2, the members are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the year in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that year, or in the year of the revision and future years if the revision affects both current and future years.

The Partnership does not have any critical accounting estimates or judgements.

4. TURNOVER

The whole of the turnover is attributable to the provision of pathology services within the United Kingdom.
