- this authority shall expire, unless sooner revoked or altered by the Company in General Meeting, on the expiry of the period of five years from the date of passing of this Resolution provided that the Company may, before such expiry, make an offer or agreement which would or might require relevant securities to be allotted after such expiry, and the Directors may allot relevant securities in pursuance of such offer or agreement as if the power conferred hereby had not expired.
- (b) words and expressions defined in or for the purposes of Part IV of the Act shall bear the same meanings in this resolution.
- 3. That pursuant to 2 above and Section 95(1) of the Act, Section 89(1) of the Act shall not apply to any allotment of shares in the capital of the Company."
