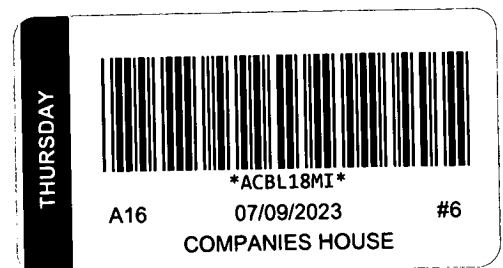

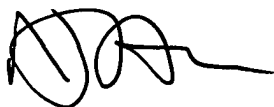

Notes

(forming part of the accounts)

1 Accounting policies

Olivers (U.K.) Limited (the "Company") is a company limited by shares and incorporated and domiciled in the UK.

These financial statements were prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 *The Financial Reporting Standard* applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland ("FRS 102").

As the Company has met the Companies Act 2006 definition of a dormant company as at and since the date of transition the accounting policies applied at the date of transition under previous GAAP have been retained as permitted by paragraph 10(m) of chapter 35 of FRS 102. As a result, there will be no change to amounts reported at 31 December 2022 until there is any change to those balances or the Company undertakes any new transactions.

The presentation currency of these financial statements is sterling.

The Company's ultimate parent undertaking, Greggs plc, includes the Company in its consolidated financial statements. The consolidated financial statements of Greggs plc are available to the public and may be obtained from Companies House. In these financial statements, the Company is considered to be a qualifying entity (for the purposes of this FRS) and has applied the exemptions available under FRS 102 in respect of the following disclosures:

- Reconciliation of the number of shares outstanding from the beginning to end of the period; and
- Cash Flow statement and related notes.

As the Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Greggs plc, the Company has taken advantage of the exemption contained in FRS 102.33 and has therefore not disclosed transactions or balances with wholly owned subsidiaries which form part of the group.

The accounting policies set out below have, unless otherwise stated, been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements.

Judgements made by the directors, in the application of these accounting policies that have significant effect on the financial statements and estimates with a significant risk of material adjustment in the next year are discussed in note 7.

Measurement convention

The financial statements are prepared on the historical cost basis.

Classification of financial instruments issued by the Company

In accordance with FRS 102.22, financial instruments issued by the Company are treated as equity only to the extent that they meet the following two conditions:

- (a) they include no contractual obligations upon the Company to deliver cash or other financial assets or to exchange financial assets or financial liabilities with another party under conditions that are potentially unfavourable to the company; and
- (b) where the instrument will or may be settled in the Company's own equity instruments, it is either a non-derivative that includes no obligation to deliver a variable number of the Company's own equity instruments or is a derivative that will be settled by the company's exchanging a fixed amount of cash or other financial assets for a fixed number of its own equity instruments.

To the extent that this definition is not met, the proceeds of issue are classified as a financial liability. Where the instrument so classified takes the legal form of the Company's own shares, the amounts presented in these financial statements for called up share capital and share premium account exclude amounts in relation to those shares.

Basic financial instruments

Investments in subsidiaries

These are separate financial statements of the Company. Investments in subsidiaries are carried at cost.

8 Ultimate parent company and parent company of larger group

The company is a wholly-owned subsidiary undertaking of Greggs plc, a company registered in England and Wales. Greggs plc is the company's ultimate parent company and controlling party. The only group in which the results of the company are consolidated is that headed by Greggs plc. The registered office of Greggs plc is Greggs House, Q9 Quorum Business Park, Newcastle upon Tyne, NE12 8BU.
