Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2021

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2021. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Principal Activities and Charitable Objectives

GMAC Film is an open access media centre that is committed to providing access to people interested in moving image. The organisation is a bridge between the local community and screen industry, offering a ladder of opportunities accessible to all, through training, facilities, expertise, information networks and opportunities in moving image to the widest possible community.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

As the whole country was working in the midst of a pandemic, GMAC Film staff and board decided to make the best use possible of the time that was not being spent in the day to day running of operations and work going on in the building. The **Youth Team** of 10 young advisers aged 16-25 met mostly online, but with a few in person meetings to consult on the design and delivery of their programme, which consisted of screenings, workshops and quizzes. Since 2013 GMAC Film has been the Glasgow delivery partner for **BFI Film Academy** a 14 week course for 16-19 year olds - this year they managed to meet in person in line with education rules for Covid 19, although some sessions were held online. Two short films were produced as the total group was divided into two to allow for physical distancing. 19 of the 20 young peopled gained the NCFE qualification. Our Care Experienced programme had to be postponed because of the pandemic. The Moving Image Arts AS Level was run between September and May, with 12 people between the ages of 16 - 25. This was again carried out in a blended way, with some more vulnerable young people opting to take part over Teams. Unfortunately online events were less well attended, and overall the figures for the year are understandably low at 50 - but those who were involved gained much from the experience. This was exacerbated because it was not possible to run the Summer School.

Sadly during the current reporting period **Cafe Flicker** was not able to take place in person due to Covid-19, although, there were four online versions run, which appeared to be po pular.

Our membership campaign, which launched in the autumn of 2019, has really worked and we now have **two hundred and forty three** Adult members and **thirty four** Youth Members. During the pandemic we have endeavoured to keep our members updated with newsletters and soci al media posts.

Simon Wilson delivered our Archive Scoping Report towards the end of the financial year, having managed to make one visit to see the material. Gary Hewitt worked tirelessly on the Archive both assembling and rationalising the material, and digitising much of it as well. There is a great deal still to be done on this, but it is a project that we will continue working on throughout 2021.

We received the Theory of Change Report from Fiona Ellis of Arrivo Consulting towards the end of the year. This work has enabled us to better tell the story of GMAC Film over the past 30 years, and will contribute to the long term sustainability of the Company, by enabling us to demonstrate the impact that we have had over the years.

Little Pictures which was commissioned at the beginning of the year, started recruitment in the summer and commissioned 8 short films with 100% coming from target groups. The training, mentoring and development of all of the participants has been very successful, and although we were not able to stay within schedule, all of the films have now been shot, and all but one delivered. Financially and critically this has been a success story, and the 2nd year of the project has now started. A screening of the first year films is scheduled for 9th December.

Staff Changes

The Filmmakers Programme manager was recruited in July 2020, followed by Meray Diner as her Assistant. Shortly thereafter we recruited an Interim Creative Director, on a fixed term six-month contract. During the period of this contract it was decided by the Board and management team to pilot a non-hierarchical structure, with each of the programme managers being given autonomy over their teams, with the General Manager having much more responsibility for the strategic direction of the company in collaboration with the CEO. We were also joined by a Development Manager in March. Since the end of the year to April 2021 Meray Diner has left to join Film Access Scotland (replaced by Caitlin McMullan) and Lucy Duncombe was appointed to Administration and Communications at Short Circuit (replaced by Jamie Dubber) The Youth Programme has also been joined by Jeannie Hamilton as Programme Assistant, and we will soon by joined by Communications and Social Media Officer Sophje Jones, and following interviews on 4th October by a Screen Start Programme Manager.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

As can be seen from the Statement of Financial Activities on page 6, the company recorded a net surplus of £107,307 (2020: £11,391) which comprised a surplus on unrestricted funds of £67,870 (2020: £6,238), an increase in tangible fixed assets of £16,040 (2020: £17,653) and a surplus on restricted funds of £23,397 (2020: deficit of -£12,500). Included in the surplus on unrestricted funds is a grant of £35,000 from Resilient Scotland, this was received late in the 2020-21 year and will be utilised in 2021-22 to support the running costs of the charity.

The net assets of the company at year end were £116,883 (2020: £9,576) of which £59,793 related to the general fund (2020: deficit of -£8,077), £33,693 represented tangible fixed assets (2020: £17,653) and £23,397 related to restricted funds (2020: nil).

Reserves policy

It has always been the intention of the management and Board that a reserves account equal to three months of company overhead costs can be achieved, which for the year ended 31 March 2021 equalled £68,564. This has been a long held ambition, but until it is possible to multi-year core funding it will be difficult to achieve this. The Board seeks to support management to find this through grant and trust funding.

At balance date, unrestricted reserves stood at £59,793 and so the trustees are aware this policy is not being met and continue to seek ways of generating unrestricted income to build this reserve.

FUTURE PLANS

Although things were difficult during lockdown, and the majority of the financial year - with people on furlough for part of the time and others on part-time furlough - a great deal was achieved by way of planning and strategical thinking, leading to the development of the flat structure of the management, and the recruitment of new members of the team. We have been successful in securing funding for the financial year 2021-22 from the Robertson Trust (3 years); Resilient Scotland, Inspiring Scotland, Screen and Creative Scotland and also Glasgow City Council - Economic Development Department (for Screen Start). We also secured match funding for two of our sponsorship projects from the Culture and Business Fund, at Arts and Business Scotland. Creative Scotland (Department of Business & Market Development) part funded a Funding Strategy report to be carried out by Simon Turner of Insight Consulting. This document has proved an excellent resource for us - particularly in making us realise just how important it is to understand our funders, and the enomous part they play in our success - not just by their financial contribution - but also by their ongoing support for all our endeavours.

We have extremely ambitious plans for the coming year, not least of which is Screen Start, and we are truly excited that Glasgow City Council has chosen to back this particular project, which will almost certainly lead to employment opportunities in the Screen Sector for people from our target groups. There is also the collaboration with MTP on a short film, which we hope will attract match funding from the Culture and Business Fund of Arts and Business Scotland - it is proposed to launch this at the AGM in December. GMAC Film Access is also being developed with funding from Inspiring Scotland, and in collaboration with Fair Access at the RCS we are developing work with Media Teachers in SIMD 1 Schools. So many new and exciting initiatives going forward.

We have a very strong staff team, and with the benefit of an enlarged and very committed board of Trustees we feel genuinely confident looking forward to the years to come.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

Glasgow Media Access Centre Limited (GMAC) is a company limited by guarantee (No. SC155843) and a recognised Scottish charity (No. SC002525), governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The GMAC Film board has a process of ongoing assessment of the necessary skills required for the board. This year we advertised for people interested in becoming Trustees, and have extremely fortunate in receiving applications from people who are in possession of the skills that were previously missing. The intention is that the Trustees also work with the management team to run subgroups to help inform the direction of the company going forward. It is felt that this integration will add so much value to the team, and will also lead to the greater involvement of the Trustees and thus to their job satisfaction. We were sad to see the departure over the year of Justine Leahy (who has gone back to freelance production and is therefore unavailable) and Rosie Street (who is relocating to Amsterdam).

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Organisational structure

GMAC Film is governed by a voluntary Board of Directors made up of industry professionals (Andy Harris, Stephen Bennett, Kieran Howe and Therese Lynch) business and financial expertise (Maria Craig, Simon Mallinson and Lesley Cherry) community development (Mohammed Alazraq and Mark Langdon) academic knowledge and expertise (Dr Lisa Kelly) and third sector knowledge and funding expertise (Atta Yaqub and Fiona Ellis). Board training will be undertaken in October by Elaine Crichton from Inspiring Scotland.

Key management remuneration

In the opinion of the trustees there are three members of key management: the General Manager, Creative Director and CEO. In the year to 31 March 2021, total employer costs for these posts were £90,369 (2020; £90,323).

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error. The board are currently preparing a risk management policy with advice from relevant organisations.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 March 2021

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Technical Equipment - 25% on cost
Office & Other Equipment - 25% on cost
Computer & Software - 25% on cost

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
