- ii. Delete Article 33. (a) for so long as East Lothian Council remains a member of the Trust, it shall have the right to appoint two persons to be Trustees and shall be entitled to remove/replace such persons as it may decide from time to time. Any such appointment or removal or replacement shall be made by notice in writing to the Trust by a duly authorised officer of East Lothian Council and shall take effect on and from the date on which the notice is lodged at the Trust's registered office. The rotation and re-election provisions contained in Article 34 do not apply to such members of the Board of Trustees.
- iii. Amend all person references to be gender inclusive by adding the following terms, highlighted in bold below, and changing 'is' to 'is/are' in the text that follows.
 - o he/she/they
 - o his/her/their
 - o him/her/them
 - o him/herself/themself

- iv. Amend all references of 'chair' to 'Chair' to ensure consistency in the document.
- v. Insert a new Article 12. **Meeting Format:** All meetings of the Charity, its Trading subsidiary and committees can be conducted as in person, by virtual means (conference telephone, video link or similar) or as hybrid meetings that are both in person and virtual. Every effort will be made to ensure all

participants can be heard and can hear each other without the need to be physically present at the same location.
