DIRECTORS' REPORT

The Directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year to 31 March 2012. The directors' report has been prepared in accordance with the provisions applicable to companies entitled to the small companies' exemption.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The company's principal activity is investment management.

REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENTS AND FUTURE PROSPECTS

During the year the company has continued to act as investment manager and Authorised Corporate Director for Saracen Investment Funds ICVC, an investment company with variable capital.

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The loss for the year after taxation was £106,514 (2011 – Profit of £85,030). Full details of the results are set out in the profit and loss account on page 7. The dividend distributed for the year was £nil (2010 - £300,000).

GOING CONCERN

The financial year ended 31 March 2012 was a transitional year for the company. The results were affected by a number of one-off costs associated with the office move by the company from Glasgow to Edinburgh. They were also affected by the heavy spend on re-branding Saracen Fund Managers, including a complete redesign of the company's website. The costs associated with the above will not be incurred in the current financial year.

Equity markets are likely to remain volatile and it is important for Saracen to increase the Sales and Marketing effort to build client relationships. The Directors monitor the business performance on an ongoing basis. If the current losses continue the Directors will assess whether additional support needs to be provided to the business through the issuance of further equity or a reassessment of the cost structure.

With a new Chief Executive in place and after the changes above, the company is well positioned for the future. The objectives are to deliver long-term investor returns above benchmark and raise further assets for Saracen's high performing Growth fund and to increase the size of the new Global Income & Growth fund. Accordingly, the directors continue to have a reasonable expectation that the Company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards. The particular accounting policies adopted are described below:

Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable from third parties for investment management services and is recognised net of value added tax as the services are provided. Turnover is recognised to the extent that it is probable that economic benefits will flow to the company and the turnover can be reliably measured.

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost, net of depreciation and any provision for impairment.

Depreciation is calculated to write off the costs less estimated residual value of fixed assets by equal annual instalments over their estimated useful lives which are considered to be:

Computer hardware and software

3 years

Fixtures & Fittings

3 years

Taxation

UK corporation tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

Deferred taxation is provided in full on timing differences that result in an obligation at the balance sheet date to pay more tax, or a right to pay less tax, at a future date, at rates expected to apply when they crystallise based on current tax rates and law. Timing differences arise from the inclusion of items of income and expenditure in taxation computations in periods different from those in which they are included in the financial statements. Deferred tax liabilities are not discounted.

A net deferred tax asset is regarded as recoverable and therefore recognised only to the extent that, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Operating leases

Rentals under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account in equal amounts over the lease term

Cash flow statement

The company has taken advantage of the exemption available under Financial Reporting Standard No. 1 (Revised) not to present a cash flow statement as it is a small entity, as defined in the Companies Act 2006.

Financial liabilities and equity

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the company after deducting all of its liabilities.
