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DIRECTOR'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2012

The director presents his report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2012.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The company operates in the Oil & Gas Sector in the United Kingdom and Internationally. Its main activities are the provision of speciality chemicals and related services offering innovative and environmentally acceptable solutions to assist our customers in increased production from their assets.

BUSINESS REVIEW

The company continues to have a strong position in the North Sea with revenues and margins in this market increasing over last year. Our other markets in North Africa and Caspian where there are significant growth opportunities are in the start up phase. In Caspian business we won in late 2011 has seen customer operational delays and this has resulted in increased administrative expenses and Inventory levels. In North Africa where there was some political unrest last year we have now re-entered the market and are re-establishing our relationships this however also resulted in additional operational expenditure in 2012 beyond what we would consider normal operating levels.

Despite incurring losses in the last two years we believe Champion has an excellent business portfolio which will ensure future growth and profitability.

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The loss for the year, after taxation, amounted to £3,225,799 (2011 - loss £1,055,453).

No dividends were paid or proposed in the year (2011 - £nil).

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2012

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

1.2 Going concern

The directors, having made due and careful enquiry and preparing forecasts, are of the opinion that the company has adequate working capital to execute its operations over the next 12 months. The directors, therefore, have made an informed judgement, at the time of approving the financial statements, that there is a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. As a result, the directors have continued to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the annual financial statements.

1.3 Consolidation

The company is itself a subsidiary company and is exempt from the requirement to prepare group accounts by virtue of Section 400 of the Companies Act 2006. These financial statements therefore present information about the company as an individual undertaking and not about its group.

1.4 Cash flow

The company, being a subsidiary undertaking where 90% or more of the voting rights are controlled within the group whose consolidated financial statements are publicly available, is exempt from the requirement to draw up a cash flow statement in accordance with FRS 1.

1.5 Turnover

Turnover comprises revenue recognised by the company in respect of goods and services supplied during the year, exclusive of Value Added Tax and trade discounts.

1.6 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases:

Land and buildings - 5% straight line

Furniture, fittings and equipment - 20% to 33% straight line

Plant and machinery - 20% straight line

1.7 Investments

Investments held as fixed assets are shown at cost less provision for impairment.

1.8 Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value after making due allowance for obsolete and slow-moving stocks. Cost includes all direct costs and an appropriate proportion of fixed and variable overheads.



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2012

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

1.9 Foreign currencies

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date.

Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate ruling on the date of the transaction.

Exchange gains and losses are recognised in the Profit and loss account.

1.10 Research and development

Research and development expenditure is written off in the year in which it is incurred.

1.11 Pensions

The company contributes to a defined contribution pension scheme and the pension charge represents the amounts payable by the company to the fund in respect of the year.

1.12 Taxation

Current tax, including UK corporation tax and foreign tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have been originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date. Timing differences are differences between the company's taxable profits and its results as stated in the accounts that arise from the inclusion of gains and losses in tax assessments in the period which are different from those recognised in the accounts. Deferred tax has been measured on a non-discounted basis.
