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#### **DIRECTORS' REPORT**

#### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2014

The directors present their report and trust accounts for the year ended 31 October 2014.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the trust's Memorandum and Articles of Association (as amended), the Companies Act 2006 and the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005.

#### Structure, governance and management

The charity is constituted as "incorporated by guarantee and not having share capital", governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. It is recognised as a charity for the purposes of s505 ICTA 1988 and is entitled under chapter 2 paragraph 13 of The Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 to describe itself as a Scottish Charity.

Directors are elected by the membership of the trust.

None of the directors have any beneficial interest in the company. All of the directors are members of the company and guarantee to contribute £1 in the event of a winding up.

The trust shall provide education, training and information to all members and officers to ensure best practice in developing its activities. The general community will be informed of the nature and benefits of the cooperative structure of the trust.

Members have democratic control of the trust with all members having one equal vote. Those serving as elected officials are accountable to the membership.

Scottish Canals and Stronachullin Estate have made rooms available at no cost for trust meetings.

The directors has assessed the major risks to which the trust is exposed and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

#### Objectives and activities

The Trust's objectives are:-

To advance the development and regeneration of Ardrishaig for the benefit of the community and the public in general following general principles of sustainable development.

To manage community land and community assets for the benefit of the community and the public in general following the principles of sustainable development.

To provide or assist in providing recreational facilities and/or organising recreational activities which will be available to members of the public at large with the object of improving the conditions of life of the community following the principles of sustainable development.

To advance the education of the community about its environment, culture and history.

To advance environmental protection or improvement including preservation and conservation of the natural environment, the promotion of sustainable development, the maintenance, improvement or provision of environmental amenities for the community and/or the preservation of buildings or sites of architectural, historic or other importance to the community.

One of the Trust's key activities is the making of grants that benefit the people and community of Ardrishaig, and the wider public. These grants are concentrated primarily within Ardrishaig community area which is defined by the PA30 postcode. Grants made outside this area are only made on the basis of clear benefit to the Ardrishaig community.

Grants are made in accordance with the Trust's Memorandum & Articles and are made mainly for the following purposes:

projects which demonstrate social benefit, economic regeneration and job creation;

sustaining cultural heritage;

improvements to community care:

increasing youth projects;

increasing energy efficiency and fuel poverty reduction;

environmental benefit;

other demonstrable social benefits for the area.

Applications for grants will not be accepted from the following:

political organisations;

national organisations, unless there is a local branch;

religious organisations;

Companies who aim to distribute a profit.

The Trust will convene an ACTion Fund Panel as required to provide recommendations on valid applications and to inform the Trust's decisions on the award of grants.

#### Achievements and performance

Summary of main activities.

Ardrishaig Renewable Energies Ltd. (ARE), which is a member of Allt Dearg Wind Farmers LLP (ADWF) and the Trusts trading arm. ARE gifted aided to the Trust £85,334 which meant The ACTion fund was able to meet in March 2014 and made net grants of £37,195.

The main activity of the Trust this year has been to purchase the North Church Hall in September this makes the Trust a key stake holder on behalf of the village in any further waterfront developments. This also made sure that the existing users of the hall would continue to benefit from it still being available to use as before.

#### **Financial review**

It is the policy of the the trust that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six month's expenditure. The directors considers that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the trust's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised. This level of reserves has been maintained throughout the year.

#### Future liabilities.

The Trust received an advance of £15,750 from the Argyll & Bute Council on behalf of Leader in 2010 The advance was made with strict conditions attached which were an explicit requirement of the terms of the grant. The money has delivered what it set out to achieve which were pathways in the woods of the KGV Park along with management plans for the village. However it is now recognised that the individuals dealing with this project made errors in its delivery of and the compliance of the required audit trail which has resulted in Leader through its agent Argyll and Bute Council requesting the return of the £15,750. Agreement has been reached to repay £1,575 a year interest free for the next 10 years at six monthly intervals of £787.50. The balance as at 31st October 2014 is £14,175.

#### Donated facilities.

Scottish Canals, Kenneth's of Stronachullin and Allt-Na-Craig House have made rooms available at no cost for Trust meetings.

#### Plans for the future

Future plans include consolidating, fulfilling and developing the Trust's present objectives. It is anticipated that the income derived from the wind farm will be in excess of £80,000 p.a.

#### 1 Accounting policies

#### 1.1 Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention.
